APE TAILS - 2024 JETER MOUNTAIN, NC APE HUNT summary.

As of August 28th I wrapped up my first APE Hunt. As most of you'all know, doing an APE Hunt in the South is not for the faint of heart. I knew trying to conduct one in SC is completely out of the question, but the Mountains of NC or GA held some promise. My research to find an affordable location to camp was not an easy task. There are no POTA campsites within a hundred or so miles that weren't already booked and located in the mountains. The only reason that I'm stressing the mountains is for cooler weather, normally 10 degrees cooler than my QTH. The bugs, no matter where you are in the South, are a constant threat. I have many large mosquito bites about my arms and ankles even after 2 days to prove it. The mosquitos made me retreat to the inside of my tiny camper late in the afternoon and evening where I have yet to find a comfortable operating position. The band conditions and activity were not good, but I had anticipated lower activity during week days. Thankfully Darin, NY7H cranked up the normal activity level with his intrepid North Western POTA and grid activations. I was fortunate to make contact with him on the 27th and 28th. Many thanks Darin for activating so many parks and grids. You are an inspiration for all of us adventurers. Monday when I arrived at my campsite I had no phone service and band conditions were at its worst. High levels of QRN and unstable band conditions were present. I only made 4 contacts on 20 meters that afternoon and evening. The next morning as I was walking my dog Mac, I noticed a faint but usable Wi-Fi signal and traced it to my host's home and he graciously gave me access. Band conditions on Tuesday were slightly better and with access to the reflector made a huge difference in the number of contacts. I made 20 contacts on Tuesday, 6 on 40 meters and the rest on 20 meters. Wednesday morning I made 3 more contacts on 20 meters before packing up. I contacted 14 different States and Ontario during the hunt. As I continue to gain experience with my portable station, it is apparent that my old laptop is the weakest link. I only have 2 USB ports and I need both, I've found that it makes a huge difference which port I plug in the SignaLink USB and the TS-590S into the computer and it's a 50/50% chance I get it right. One way I have RF issues and have to reduce my power to 20-25 watts and the other I can go as high as 40 watts and possibly more. I now know which way works best if I can remember it LOL. The one thing I'm most proud of is my vertical antenna. It is possibly the best portable vertical antenna around. Made by TN07 Engineering, from Tennessee, model 102 Stealth. It is a push up 31' fiberglass pole with wire

that folds down to under 48" and you attach a 35' length of wire to the top and fasten it to the nearest tree in a Vee configuration. In the desert of Utah, I just fastened the wire to a stake in the ground. An 82 year old man has no problem lifting this antenna up and placing it in the antenna mount. I do run ten 17' ground radials and sometimes add some 34' redials, but didn't use them this trip. The antenna held up to some mighty strong winds and gusts over 35mph this past April in Utah.

Thanks to all the Hunters out there for making this a fun APE event.
